

PROGRAM REPORT

If there were ever any questions about who our church is, they were answered loudly and proudly this summer at Luther Crest as hundreds of kids, staff, and adults each week emphatically reminded us that "We Are the Church!" This was our 80th anniversary theme, and we embraced it fully, exploring what it means to be called to be God's church for each other and in the world. In the unplugged, participatory, and relational way



that camp does best, we explored our call to Gather, Love, Forgive, Challenge, and Praise together as the church, knowing that "All things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to God's purpose!" (Romans 8:28)



We served almost 2500 campers this summer through our Onsite,
Residential, and Offsite Day Camp programs, averaging over 350 campers per week all summer long! Each camp season for the last 5 years we've seen these numbers increase, and we celebrate as the influence of Luther Crest's summer programming spreads the Gospel of Christ to more youth

each year. But not only do we celebrate the width of our reach, we celebrate the depth of our relationships with all of these campers, and in the quality of faith formation work that we do together. One result of this depth is the incredible amount of our campers who return for many summers, choosing over and over again to prioritize their faith and this community.


This includes many campers who eventually come back to serve on staff at Luther Crest. Out of our 46 full time summer staff this summer, over half of them were previous campers at Luther Crest - wow!


An important aspect of being the church together, is being the church in the world together. Our Offsite Day Camp programs are a great example of how we can live this out. We traveled to communities all over Minnesota this summer to bring the joy of camp right into the home congregations of hundreds of kids each week! This summer we sent out 24 offsite teams, 3 more than last summer, and partnered with around 32 congregations in the process. Just as the walls of any church building don't contain the church, neither do the property lines of Luther Crest Bible Camp. We are all in this together, and as Luther Crest grows our relationships with partner congregations from all over the state and beyond, we are grateful to do this work together!

Celebrating 80 years of impactful outdoor ministry this summer reminded us that we are not alone in the work we do. Our 46 phenomenal summer staff were joined by 14 different staff alumni who came back to camp to work a week or more throughout this summer season. That's 14 leaders formed by this place and sent into the world to do a whole spectrum of beautiful ministries who felt the call to come back to camp this summer, if only for a week, to serve this important mission. These sorts of partnerships mean the world to us, to the staff, and to our campers. This is just one way that the relationships made here at camp live on for lifetimes to come. Thank you to everyone who partners with us in ministry - you are Luther Crest, and together We Are the Church!








INTRODUCING MASON

RETREATS REPORT

The past year has been a wonderful reminder of the gift of community that gathers at Luther Crest with folks from all walks of life. Our overnight retreats have continued to thrive while welcoming confirmation groups, women's and men's retreats, weddings and reunions, and more. Each group that comes through our doors experience not only comfortable lodging and delicious food, but also the beauty of God's creation and a sense of belonging. Throughout this year of celebration, we have hosted nearly 10,000 retreat guests!

Overnight retreat guest numbers: 2084 guests

Day event guest numbers: 818 guests

Calvary at the Lake attendees: 7,553 (up from 1,250 total in 2012, the first

summer Calvary held their services at Luther Crest)

Pickleball groups: 8 different groups each week



We also host a variety of day groups from sports and activity banquets, staff and council meetings, service projects, outdoor education and day of camp experiences. The shorter events still carry the same spirit of welcome but guests from schools, congregations and community groups can participate in ways that fit their schedules.

A key part of our ministry is to listen to those we serve. Every group that attends LCBC receives an evaluation of their time with us-starting from the first call or email connection. The feedback and reflections we receive are invaluable and often

I love the quilts and the use of the meeting room was fantastic. I have always been impressed with Tammie. She gets back to me immediately and is welcoming and flexible. Can't say enough good about the meals. I loved the fresh fruit, the lettuce salads, large portions and family friendly options. Fit our family great (even my vegetarian granddaughter). The content and energy of the program was great. Madeline, our counselor, always gave us a 'heads up' about what was happening for the day and my family could choose. She also gave us great Bible Dives just for us which was a great time of family bonding. We appreciated the attention Henri and Madeline, and all the Staff gave us. The younger grandchildren felt very cared for as we were treated to unexpected hospitality allowing Family Camp to line up first for meals. We would love to return based on our present and past positive experiences. If we don't it would only be because grandchildren are getting older and are working etc. We'll see!!

High School Sports Banquet: Everything was communicated very clearly via Tammie...everything was excellent! Everything was set up and ready to go when we arrived! The meal was fantastic! The staff was super accommodating! We got there a little earlier than planned and they were very helpful with everything and very friendly! Luther Crest is a perfect place to hold a banquet event-reasonable pricing, excellent food, and fantastic hosts. We loved it!

Evening event: As the Adult Ministry Coordinator for First Lutheran Church, I have the privilege of gathering people together for spiritual growth and building relationships. Luther Crest was the perfect setting for our recent event, Sips & Scripture! The space provided us with plenty of room to come together and enjoy an evening learning about Jesus' turning water into wine. We had the opportunity to explore and taste various types of

wine in a relaxed, welcoming atmosphere, while sharing hors d'oeuvres and engaging in great conversation. It was truly a blessing to grow in faith and community in such a beautiful place.

Women's Weekend: I really appreciated the timely communication and especially the room list help so I could sort out how many beds were in each room. That was super helpful. We always appreciate how careful and caring the kitchen staff are regarding our dietary needs. I know some of them are strange but the care they are given makes all the difference and one of the main reasons we keep coming back. So grateful for clean and wonderful buildings, amazing food, and supportive staff. We did have one little issue with the heat being up high and not being able to figure it out and the hosts were on top of it right away. So grateful for them!



Youth Retreat: Hi Tammie —Just wanted to let you know, Henri was FABULOUS!!!! He always has a smile on his face and is soooo welcoming, kind, and such a super role model to our youth. I especially wanted to thank Henri and team for the excited welcome they gave us all when our school bus pulled into the parking lot. It really set the tone for our whole stay. I really really really appreciated the help from Henri and the team unpacking the bus and bringing all the food to the kitchen. Seriously!!! This was sooooo nice because for a good chunk of the bus ride, I was feeling overwhelmed thinking about how I was going to get all the food to the cafeteria and still have time to set up camp, get to worship, and then prep the meals. Thank you all for being a part of making a difference and making an impact on every child, every youth, every family, every volunteer, every individual who is a part of our mission. Through the amazing generosity of our supporters throughout this year of celebration, we were able to raise just over 550,000 for our 2024-2025 Annual Fund.



Fundraising Events: The 80th Anniversary Summer Festival and Auction and the



24th Annual Golf Scramble were all a great success and raised a total of over \$95,000! With our goal of raising \$80,000 for our 80th Anniversary year, we were blown away by the generosity of our donors and supporters! Our auction, with over 130 bidders, raised over \$75,000 through the online and live auctions as well as ticket sales for the festival.

During this auction weekend, we also hosted the 80th Anniversary Alumni Reunion with nearly 100 alumni in attendance throughout the weekend! It was such a joyous weekend having so many camp enthusiasts on site. Our 24th Annual Golf Scramble was also a success and raised over \$20,000 with 22 teams attending at the Lake Miltona Golf Course. Thank you to everyone who helps make these fun, purposeful events happen each year! A special thank you to the volunteers and committee members for these fundraising events!





We are also excited to be offering our Christmas Bake Sale again this winter season! Orders will begin Nov. 1 with the pick up days at Luther Crest being Dec. 12 and 13. Keep an eye out for emails, socials, and mailings regarding the bake sale coming up soon!

- 350 new donors added since 2021.
- 16 new monthly sustained givers added since 2021.
- With over 51 new donors at the \$1,000 Builder Level added since 2021, we have reached our goal of 50 new Builders by 2025!

Dear Friends of Luther Crest,


